THESIS SUMMARY

This doctoral thesis explores the interactions between sustainable tourism and the socio-economic and cultural development of the Central Dobrogea region of Romania, with a focus on how sustainable tourism practices can contribute to improving the quality of life in local communities. The study integrates concepts from the fields of sustainability, social responsibility and cultural heritage valorisation, providing a new perspective on tourism development as a driving force for economic and social progress.

The main aim of the research is to identify and analyse the impact of sustainable tourism on local communities and to assess how cultural heritage can be effectively used to promote a form of tourism that is not only economically viable, but also environmentally responsible and socially inclusive. The thesis also addresses the role of Local Action Groups (LAGs) in supporting sustainable tourism initiatives and analyses their impact on the quality of tourism services. By using a combination of quantitative and qualitative methods, including bibliometric analysis, surveys and interviews, the research provides an assessment of local community perceptions and the direct economic impact of tourism. The results indicate a positive correlation between the implementation of sustainable tourism practices and positive community perceptions, emphasizing the importance of social responsibility within the tourism industry.

In conclusion, this thesis contributes to the literature by offering new insights into how sustainable tourism can function as a tool for sustainable local development, suggesting that integrating social responsibility and valuing cultural heritage are essential for the long-term success of the tourism industry. Policy and practice recommendations emphasize the need for integrated strategies that promote sustainability and community involvement in tourism planning and development processes.

The PhD thesis is structured to provide a detailed and in-depth exploration of the intersections between sustainable tourism and its impact on the socio-economic and cultural development of the rural Central Dobrogea area in Romania.
